- **May 5, 2018**

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

10 AM to 12 PM

Marshall County Building parking lot off S. Grand St., Marshall

Items Accepted: Old gasoline, kerosene, fuel oil (must be in approved container), brake fluid, pesticides, old prescriptions, anti-freeze, solvents, cleaners, stain and oil based paint, acids, pool chemicals, aerosol cans, household batteries (includes button), mercury, fluorescent light bulbs, CFL bulbs, sharps sealed in a laundry detergent bottle. **NO latex paint.**

- **June 2, 2018**

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

10 AM to 12 PM

Toeller Building parking lot, 190 E. Michigan Ave., Battle Creek

Items Accepted: Old gasoline, kerosene, fuel oil (must be in approved container), brake fluid, pesticides, old prescriptions, anti-freeze, solvents, cleaners, stain and oil based paint, acids, pool chemicals, aerosol cans, household batteries (includes button), mercury, fluorescent light bulbs, CFL bulbs, sharps sealed in a laundry detergent bottle. **NO latex paint.**

- **June 26, 2018**

Scrap Tire Collection

12 PM to 6 PM or when semi-trailer is full

Village of Tekonsha Offices, 537 N. Church St., Tekonsha

No early drop-off

Items Accepted: Participants are limited to 10 passenger tires per event. Event is limited to household and residential scrap tires only. No commercial businesses may bring tires to the cleanup event. Oversized tires such as tractor tires and heavy equipment tires will not be accepted. Rims must be removed.

- **July 28, 2018**

Scrap Tire Collection

9 AM to 3 PM or when semi-trailer is full

Ketchum Field, intersection of N. Clark St. and E. North St., Albion

Early drop-off allowed. Place tires in designated area in parking lot July 25 – July 27.

Items Accepted: Participants are limited to 10 passenger tires per event. Event is limited to household and residential scrap tires only. No commercial businesses may bring tires to the cleanup event. Oversized tires such as tractor tires and heavy equipment tires will not be accepted. Rims must be removed.

- **August 25, 2018**

Electronics and Polystyrene (Styrofoam #6) Collection

Joint collection with City of Battle Creek

9 AM to 1 PM

City of Battle Creek Department of Public Works Building, 150 S. Kendall St., Battle Creek

Items Accepted: Electronics - Computers, televisions, game systems, vacuums, VCRs, clocks, fans, heaters, irons, radios, phones, scanners, MP3 players, Satellite dishes, cameras, curling irons, clippers, holiday lights, printers, remotes, hair dryers, power tools, small kitchen appliances and car batteries. Will accept air conditioners and dehumidifiers. **Styrofoam** - Food and beverage containers, packaging materials with #6. **NO peanuts or construction foam.**

- **September 8, 2018**

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

10 AM to 12 PM

Marshall County Building parking lot off S. Grand St., Marshall

Items Accepted: Old gasoline, kerosene, fuel oil (must be in approved container), brake fluid, pesticides, old prescriptions, anti-freeze, solvents, cleaners, stain and oil based paint, acids, pool chemicals, aerosol cans, household batteries (includes button), mercury, fluorescent light bulbs, CFL bulbs, sharps sealed in a laundry detergent bottle. **NO latex paint.**

- **September 22, 2018**

Scrap Tire Collection

9 AM to 12 PM or when semi-trailer is full

Athens Township Offices, 130 E. Burr Oak St., Athens

No early drop-off

Items Accepted: Participants are limited to 10 passenger tires per event. Event is limited to household and residential scrap tires only. No commercial businesses may bring tires to the cleanup event. Oversized tires such as tractor tires and heavy equipment tires will not be accepted. Rims must be removed.
