Marshall Recycling Center to Expand Hours Starting May 18

Starting Friday, May 18, the Marshall Recycling Center will be adding Friday hours. Calhoun County residents will now be able to use the recycling center, located at the Calhoun County Road Department, 13300 15 Mile Rd., from 2 PM – 6 PM on Fridays.

New hours of operation:

Tuesday 10 AM to 2 PM

Thursday 2 PM to 6 PM

Friday 2 PM to 6 PM

Saturday 10 AM to 2 PM

Recyclers are asked to separate their recycling in to the following categories:

- Aluminum – cans, foils, and trays
- Steel and tin cans - cans
- Clear glass – jugs, bottles, and jars
- #1 PET plastic bottles – clear bottles, clear jars
- #2 HDPE colored plastic bottles – jugs and bottles
- #2 HDPE natural plastic bottles – jugs and bottles
- Mixed plastic #1 non-bottles and #3-#7 containers – clam shells, dairy containers, bottles, lids
- Newspaper – newspaper and phonebooks
- Magazines – magazines, catalogs, and glossy paper
- Office paper – computer paper, notebook paper, mail, envelopes
- Cardboard – plain and corrugated, food boxes, shipping boxes, postcards, and cards
- Polystyrene (Styrofoam #6) – egg cartons, meat trays, coffee cups, packaging with #6
- Household batteries – alkaline and lithium

All items should be empty, clean and dry.
